

Banwell - A tale of Woe.





In order to set up our stand at the Bristol Bike Show, we have to collect carpet, scaffolding, turntable, electrics etc. from their home in Banwell (nr W-S-M). Previously Martin Treasure had provided a home for this equipment in his large garage in Midsomer Norton. When he sold up and moved, we had to find a new home for this stuff, a moment we were dreading.

Fortunately, Terry Adams offered us storage in a garage at the bottom of his garden in W-S-M, very pleasant, and we were

usually offered coffee and sandwiches when we arrived. However, Terry then had to move, but kindly offered us a shed in an orchard that he owned in Banwell. The shed was OK (and we are very grateful), but getting to it involved a 50-yard trek over a usually water-logged field which got increasingly muddy after each journey to the van. We had to park by the entrance. This journey obviously had to be done twice (taking and returning), and it was usually raining when it happened. Moving some of the heavy stuff was a real pain - the turntable and metal scaffolding were both heavy and awkward.

Just giving you a bit of context - obviously you can see that the visit to Banwell was not a favoured choice of things to do, particularly when the weather was particularly foul. This time Tony L, Andy S, and myself, arrived at the orchard entrance 11amish. Both Tony and Andy had brought their vans. Andy from Brushford (Exmoor). Andy's was the main carrier, as Tony was converting his into a camper, and already had two bikes on board. In order to facilitate loading, Andy had to reverse into the entrance. He started this manoeuvre, and then the van would not move. The clutch slave cylinder had failed. I immediately saw this as an act of God - and started dancing - even Tony smiled. The result was that we had to pack a minimum amount of stuff into the limited space in Tony's van, and leave all the heavy stuff (scaffolding, turntable etc.) Whooppee!!!!!

Andy's van was eventually recovered, and is currently (25/2/2025) awaiting repair. Andy could have done without another dose of bad luck!
